Instructions for submitting an abstract

You are invited to submit an abstract before December 15th. **Acknowledgment of receipt will be sent automatically. If you do not receive any acknowledgment, please contact us again.**

For talks, a maximum of two abstracts will be accepted for each speaker. All authors of accepted abstracts must register and be paid in full by the early registration deadline (currently February 2018). Authors failing to comply with this rule will not be included in the Conference Programme.

Oral (spoken) presentations will be limited to 20 minutes: 15 minutes for presentation and 5 minutes for questions. Contributed oral presentations will be grouped by topic. If your abstract is accepted but cannot be accommodated as an oral presentation, we may offer you the opportunity to present a poster. All oral presentation rooms will be equipped with a computer and a data projector.

Poster presenters will receive general instructions on poster format once the abstract is accepted. Detailed information and instructions on presentations at the meeting will be available to presenters several months before the meeting.

Abstract (limited to 150 words)	“Maps” are familiar to us as graphic and accessible ways of representing vast quantities of complex, related data. Perhaps distracted by the visual connotations of the term, there appears to be an under appreciation of these concepts in the regularly organised, monochromatic databases of references and metadata which have come to be recognised as ‘systematic maps’. Often tucked away in the supplementary information as accompaniments to detailed reports and eye-catching visualisations, it is important to remember that systematic maps are research products in

	<p>their own right; deserving of well-considered formatting and organisation.</p> <p>Drawing on published examples, and ongoing experience of systematic mapping in the field of environmental health, this talk illustrates how failure to appreciate the relational nature of coded data compromises the clarity of systematic maps. The frustrations poor data management can cause end users are highlighted, and a discussion of how these frustrations can be avoided presented.</p>
