Instructions for submitting an abstract

You are invited to submit an abstract before December 15th. **Acknowledgment of receipt will be sent automatically. If you do not receive any acknowledgment, please contact us again.**

For talks, a maximum of two abstracts will be accepted for each speaker. All authors of accepted abstracts must register and be paid in full by the early registration deadline (currently February 2018). Authors failing to comply with this rule will not be included in the Conference Programme.

Oral (spoken) presentations will be limited to 20 minutes: 15 minutes for presentation and 5 minutes for questions. Contributed oral presentations will be grouped by topic. If your abstract is accepted but cannot be accommodated as an oral presentation, we may offer you the opportunity to present a poster. All oral presentation rooms will be equipped with a computer and a data projector. Poster presenters will receive general instructions on poster format once the abstract is accepted. Detailed information and instructions on presentations at the meeting will be available to presenters several months before the meeting.

Abstract (limited to 150 words)	The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) is one of the world's largest conservation donors. The recent USAID Biodiversity Policy reaffirms the Agency's mandate to use, share, and generate evidence to maximize the impact of its programmatic investments in biodiversity conservation. To implement the Policy's evidence provisions, USAID's Office of Forestry and Biodiversity is: (1) providing staff with relevant and accessible evidence products, (2) developing detailed guidance about the use and generation of evidence in biodiversity programs specifically tailored to overseas mission staff, and (3) providing technical assistance to staff engaged in different aspects of program design and implementation. Taken together, these efforts seek to build stronger linkages between evidence-based approaches and adaptive management of the Agency's biodiversity programs. We describe these efforts and discuss some of the challenges and opportunities encountered in operationalizing evidence-based approaches across

	different overseas missions and contexts with diverse programming needs.
